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Training

4.1 Details of training opportunities on the unit

<p>We are approved for ICM training at all levels of training. Currently, providing training for ICM trainees (stage 1 and 2), variety of anaesthetic trainees for all their stages in ICM blocks and internal medicine trainees. We provide training for foundation doctors too. Trainees are getting experiences in admission and discharge procedures, non-invasive and invasive ventilations, advanced invasive monitoring, use of US in critical care environment (FICE supervisors in hospital), CRRT techniques, basic interpretation of X-Rays, MDT meetings, microbiology WR, participation on quality improvement projects/ studies/ research activities and participation on ICM teaching/ simulation.</p> <p>On call doctors are members of medical emergency and trauma team.</p>
