3.6 Details of research projects being undertaken within the unit

We actively participate in a number of national research projects: Currently REST and POPPI, as well as other large multinational RCT. We have been one of the biggest recruiters for a number of major internationally published trial eg OSCAR.

Benchmark studies are also undertaken and we have close affiliation with Leeds University. There is great opportunity for undertaking research and due to the size of the unit, patient recruitment is easily facilitated. Research is led by Professor Bellamy on this site

3.7 How is the unit staffed

Unit is staffed 2 consultants 7 days week... minimum junior staffing non-airway trainee (often ACCS), middle tier trainee, senior tier (often anaesthetic/ ICM trainees + fellows). We often have additional personnel eg ACCP, resp reg trainees and MTi trainees too.

Rota follows a 1:7 or 1:8 pattern.

4.1 Details of training opportunities on the unit

Exposure to a broad case mix, including tertiary specialities such as renal and liver transplant, thoracics, haem-oncological
 Access to on-site training suite, with ability to utilise simulation for bronchoscopy, venous access and real-time critical care scenarios.
 Ability to undertake recognised ECHO accreditation/ 5 FICE accredited trainers
 Weekly teachings on the unit covering key themes relating to critical care
 Monthly teaching for trainees, focused on the FFICM syllabus and top 30 topics
 Regional meetings for Yorkshire Intensivists.

4.2 Details of departmental teaching days

Weekly Wednesday lunchtime teaching-trainee led and facilitated by a consultant.
 Monthly teaching across site aimed at FFICM syllabus
 Exposure to consultants actively involved in shaping FFICM curriculum and examination

4.3 Details of clinical governance meetings and / or M & M

Monthly audit, which encompasses M&M
 Opportunity to undertake monthly governance and business meetings to gain further insight into management roles expected as a a critical care consultant

4.4 Number of trainees on each tier of the rota

We have 3 tiers of trainees: 7 in a non-airway tier, 7 in a middle tier and 8 on the senior tier + a number of ACCP
