3.4 Overview of case mix within the unit

Musgrove Park Hospital is a large district general hospital serving a population of 350000 as well as providing some specialist services for the whole of Somerset (catchment 544000). Services in addition to the usual DGH services, include major vascular, spinal surgery, max fax and bariatric surgery. The trust also provides 24/7 interventional radiology, PCI and thrombolysis services, and has a national award winning regional cancer centre.

The critical care unit comprises 3 pods of 6 beds for mixed level 2/3 capacity. The unit admits a small number of paediatric patients but most are stabilised prior to transfer to PICU in Bristol.

The unit is proud of it's CQC 'Caring-Outstanding' rating. The Trust has recently merged with Yeovil District Hospital.

3.7 How is the unit staffed

There are 2 consultants 0800-1800 during the week, and until 1300 at weekends. The critical care unit is divided into pods with a consultant responsible for each pod.

Junior medical cover is divided into two tiers. The senior tier is usually a specialist trainee in anaesthesia or ICM who provides dedicated advanced airway capability for critical care 24 hours/day. The junior tier comprises a minimum of 2 doctors at all times and is made up of doctors ranging from F1, IMT, ACCS, anaesthetic trainees and respiratory registrars on ICM placements.

We currently have 2 qualified and 3 trainee ACCPs, and an advanced ICM trainee.

Part 4

Training

4.1 Details of training opportunities on the unit

Musgrove Park Hospital has a progressive and cohesive Critical Care department which has an excellent reputation for training. The department is rated by anaesthetic trainees as a friendly and supportive place to learn (GMC survey), with many choosing to return as Consultants. There are twice daily Consultant led ward rounds and ample opportunities for learning. Simulation is well set up both in situ and within the simulation centre.

Trainees are exposed to a wide range of interventions including, invasive ventilation, non-invasive ventilation, percutaneous tracheostomies, bronchoscopy and focused ultrasound investigations in line with FICE, CUSIC and FUSIC programs. There are 2 FICE mentors and weekly bedside teaching sessions from an echo technician for those wishing to pursue FICE accreditation.

There is weekly consultant led teaching and journal club, weekly radiology MDT and junior doctor led case debriefing meetings. Regular in situ simulation is run within critical care.

There is a 24/7 Critical Care Outreach service and established follow up clinic.

4.4 Number of trainees on each tier of the rota

Presently there are 14 central doctors and ACCPs on the junior tier of the rota working approximately a 1 in 3 weekend pattern, with all on-call shifts being 12.5 hours. The senior rota is staffed by anaesthetic and ICM trainees who work variable shift patterns according to their current placement.
