# 3.4 Overview of case mix within the unit

The Acute Intensive Care Unit (AICU) at Wythenshawe Hospital admits a wide variety of medical and surgical patients. Post-operative care is provided for complex general, urological and tertiary maxillofacial surgery. As the regional Burns Centre for the North West, we have 2 dedicated Burns ICU beds in close proximity to the Burns Theatre.

Wythenshawe Hospital is a national centre for Cystic Fibrosis and Aspergillosis. It provides many tertiary respiratory, cardiology and cardiothoracic services including primary PCI and heart/lung transplant.

The Cardiothoracic Critical Care Unit at Wythenshawe Hospital is an ECMO centre. On AICU, we admit acute respiratory failure patients post ECMO and provide a tertiary ventilation weaning service for the North West.

#### 3.6 Details of research projects being undertaken within the unit

There is an active programme of research on the ICU which trainees are encouraged to engage with. Research is supported by a team of research nurses. Fortnightly Unit research meetings occur to which all trainees are invited. Research studies on the ICU include a mix of (a) experimental medicine studies conducted "in-house" where the investigators are consultants on the ICU; (b) multi-centre, academic NIHR portfolio studies and (c) commercial trials.

#### 3.7 How is the unit staffed

On-site consultant presence 8am-8pm 7 days a week and overnight as required. There is a two-tier trainee rota (airway and non-airway) with a minimum of one airway trainee present 24/7. We have 2 qualified ACCPs with more joining in the next 12 months. During weekday normal working hours there are 5 trainees/ACCPs as a minimum. 2 in the evenings and overnight. 4 during weekend days.

# **Training**

#### 4.1 Details of training opportunities on the unit

The AICU at Wythenshawe Hospital provides excellent training opportunities for trainees. As a busy teaching hospital with a large variety of tertiary services, we offer interesting and stimulating clinical opportunities.

The Unit has trainees from a wide range of specialties including ICM, Emergency Medicine, ACCS, Anaesthesia, Acute Medicine, Respiratory Medicine, and Foundation Training. We offer advanced (stage 3) training in ICM. We also offer a variety of SSY modules including echocardiography, home ventilation, quality improvement and education. Additionally, we facilitate placements and training for trainee ACCPs, student AAs and medical students.

There is a comprehensive Consultant-led teaching programme, which is mapped to the ICM curriculum and includes simulation-based sessions. We also have weekly journal club led by an advanced ICM trainee.

Our weekly M&M meetings provide an opportunity to analyse and learn from previous cases. Representatives from other specialties involved in the cases are invited to add to the discussion.

There is a weekly Burns MDT and we have daily Microbiology ward rounds.

# 4.2 Details of departmental teaching days

Weekly Consultant-led teaching 2-4pm (day of the week varies depending on Consultant availability)

Weekly Journal Club 2-4pm (Monday or Friday)

Daily teaching ward rounds

# 4.3 Details of clinical governance meetings and / or M & M

#### 4.4 Number of trainees on each tier of the rota

There is a two-tier trainee rota with an average of 7 trainees on each tier. Trainees must have their IAC to be allocated to the airway tier.
