3.6 Details of research projects being undertaken within the unit

3.7 How is the unit staffed?

Two ICM consultants on duty Monday through Friday. One ICM Consultant on weekend days. 24 hour Consultant Intensivist cover.

Trainee rota is made up of 12 trainees/TG/fellow from the Foundation programme, Intensive Care Medicine (stage 1-3), Acute Care Common Stem, Anaesthesia, Acute Medicine, Respiratory Medicine and Internal Medicine training programmes. This ensures 2 trainees on duty at all times meeting GPICS standards. One Trust Grade doctor. One Educational Fellow doctor.

Two daily wards rounds. True multi-disciplinary morning ward round comprising of:- two Consultant Intensivists, Consultant Microbiologist, Senior ICU Pharmacist, Senior Physio, Dietician, Trainee doctors, Nurse-in-Charge, bedside nurse.

Trainee ACCP program started February 2023.

Nursing in accordance with GPICS standards.
