3.7 How is the unit staffed?

Consultants: Currently 9 consultants cover intensive care daytime sessions and out of hours on an on call rota. This includes covering evening handover rounds and full ward rounds at weekends.

Junior staff: Anaesthesia stage 1 and 2 ICM modules are facilitated with dedicated daytime allocation to ICU. Other anaesthetic trainees are allocated to ICU on an ad hoc basis for resuscitation and transfer training. One Foundation Year 2 doctor, one ACCS-EM post and 2 IMT2 doctors also cover daytime sessions and contribute to a rota tier for out-of-hours cover. This is supported by a further 2 tiers of anaesthesia staff (NCCGs and anaesthetists in training) out of hours, covering ICU, resuscitation calls, emergency theatre and delivery suite.

FUSIC heart training

Formal education and simulation training in Trust teaching fellow roles

Long term venous access devices

Opportunity to attend consultant-led ICU follow-up clinics

4.2 Details of departmental teaching days

Weekly teaching:

- Intensive care teaching sessions (Wednesday morning)
- Journal Club (Tuesday morning)
- Anaesthesia half day teaching per month

Twice yearly: Intensive Care Multidisciplinary Airway Skills Teaching (iMAST) – medical, nursing and physiotherapy joint teaching on ICU airway skills and equipment

Annually: SimSTAR (transfer of critically ill) course

Annually: Regional ICM study day hosted

Ad hoc: in situ Simulation

4.3 Details of clinical governance meetings and / or M & M

Monthly combined audit and M&M meetings within anaesthetic and intensive care department.

Department actively involved with quality improvement projects.

Case reviews – multidisciplinary and cross-specialty involvement encouraged.

Quarterly ICU multidisciplinary meetings.

4.4 Number of trainees on each tier of the rota

When all slots are filled, there are 8 doctors in training (IMT2, CT1-2 anaesthetics, ACCS-EM) on first tier rota covering ICU with input and additional cover from second tier (7 x ST3-4) and third tier rota (8 x ST5-7/non-consultant career grade doctors).
