Training

4.1 Details of training opportunities on the unit

7 day week consultant led ward rounds.

Exposure to major trauma, management of head injuries and subarachnoid haemorrhage as well as postoperative care of the neurosurgical patient. Post-op care of major urological oncology including robotic cases in urology, gynaecology and general surgery. Burns Unit receiving up to 40% burns for management.

Over half the consultants are FICE accredited to supervise echocardiograms, with more in the pipeline. .
