3.4 Overview of case mix within the unit

The ICU at Exeter is a general, mixed 15 bedded intensive care unit. We currently admit around 1000 patients a year, including approximately 3% paediatrics. All surgical specialties are represented, with exception of cardiothoracics and neurosurgery.

The hospital has over 800 beds and is a regional centre for head and neck cancer, haematology, renal, neurology, interventional radiology, cardiology, intestinal failure and complex asthma.
